

ATTENDANCE




The whole school attendance for week ending 6th September 2019 was 97.4%. It's only by working together we can achieve our target of 96%. The last week of term's attendance is listed below:



VOLUNTEERING IN SCHOOL

Volunteers are always welcome and valued at our school. There is no doubt that the children benefit from the additional support. You may be asked to undertake some of the following activities:

GOLD CARDS

The positive recognition of good behaviour is a key element of our classroom as we believe it helps to motivate the children. It is always sincere and meaningful.
