The story is told completely in verse, which is a type of poetry.

For your English homework, I would like you to write your own poem about friendship. You can choose the style of poem you do this in! There are loads to choose from. For example, will it be an acrostics poem? A poem with rhyme? A shape poem? Whichever style you choose, poetry is a way to be creative with words to create meaning, so I am looking forward to see what you come up with! It is always a good idea to read other examples to get inspiration.

You may also decide to illustrate your poem, too!





Maybe you could add illustrations to your work, too! Geography: Complete the water cycle in a bag activity. Remember, it needs to have direct sunlight for it to work! If we have a cloudy and grey week, try again when it is sunny. Record your observations and keep your bag to bring into school!

20.05	Homework due in.	





Water Cycle Experiment

You will need:

- plastic sandwich bag (sealable)
- water
- sticky tape
- blue food colouring · window (with
- permanent marker




Draw the sun, clouds and water accumulation of the water cycle onto the plastic sandwich bag with a permanent marker.

direct sunlight)

On the plastic bag, draw the arrows and water drops of the water cycle. Clearly label onto the bag:

- evaporation
- condensation
- precipitation
- accumulation



Carefully fill the sandwich bag with water until it is approximately $\frac{1}{4}$ full. Drop two drops of blue food colouring into the water. Seal the bag.




Stick the water cycle bag to the window in direct sunlight. The window needs to have direct sunlight for the experiment to work. Leave for around an hour.



Observe the effects of the water cycle. Can you identify the different stages of the water cycle?





Geography Challenge:

Imagine you are a rain drop. Could you write a diary entry about your journey through the water cycle? You can choose where your journey begins, because you will still go through each stage of the cycle! How would it feel to fall to the ground as rain? How would it feel to evaporate? Make sure you are using key words in your writing!
